We are 95% in 2026. Phonics results: Disadvantaged vs not disadvantaged The attainment gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils remains substantial. In 2024/25, 68.1% of disadvantaged pupils met the expected standard, whilst 85.1% of non-disadvantaged pupils achieved this level. Notably, the results for disadvantaged pupils showed a slight decrease from 68.7% in 2023/24, whilst non-disadvantaged pupils maintained their upward trajectory from 84.8% to 85.1%. Phonics screening check outcomes for Y2 – 98% up from 92.3%(National 89% in 2024) Above national for this and for PP pupils at 100% for Y2 KS2 Reading EXS 2026 was 76% and GDS was 33%. It was above national for the second year running and for PP pupils it was 68% and above national for PP which is 64% (National for all pupils was 75% in 2025)

This is a new primary school after deamalgamation in September 2024. Below is a summary of the data for 2025/26

		KS2 Writing EXS 2026 72% which is in line with national average (National 72%) and similar to 2025 at 76% . KS2 maths EXS- 78% (National was 74% in 2025) and the same as 2025. RWMaths combined at EXS 2026 was 65% and above national average for the second year running after 47% in 2024 and 37% in 2023 (National 62% in 2025). We are now achieving above national average for 2 years running. Disadvantaged pupils RWMaths is 55% again for the second year running so above the NA for 2025 (46% National in 2024) For greater depth, the school is in line with national average in reading (33%).
All children to access the maximum amount possible of Quality First Teaching by attending school every day	Maintain statutory year groups' attendance at above national levels	National primary school attendance 2024 – 2025 94.1% School attendance – is up to 94.7% from 94.4% in 2024/25 and 93.1% the year before so in line national average and PA is down from 33% to 16.1% and was 13.4% in 2025 with severe absence at 0.3% Pupil premium attendance for the year 2025/26 is 94.3% with national being 92% which means we are well above national averages for disadvantaged pupils with SEND K and E pupils above national in relation to their peers nationally.
• Our Pupil premium spend has had a very positive impact on school improvement this year. • Attainment in KS2 rose dramatically in the last 2 years with us reaching above national average 2 years running. • Disadvantaged attainment for PP pupils is a strength as is EAL. • Disadvantaged pupils outperform their groups nationally- for example in combined in 2025 46% nationally of disadvantaged pupils got expected. In 2025 we have outperformed this significantly with 55% and this has been repeated in 2026
